
Ojai Valley Fire Safe Council

Founded in 2000 501(c)(3) Nonprofit



- Promote wildfire safety in the Ojai
 Valley through community driven
 collaboration, action and education
- 2000-2019 -managed 26 federally funded grants totaling over \$1.6M with approx. \$2M in matching contributions
- Currently managing \$1.95M in projects
- Administered community-based programs and projects
- Online resources
- Local and regional partnerships





Ojai Valley & Fire

- Top 1% of the nation for wildfire risk (top 3% in CA)
- Surrounded by rugged mountains
- Chaparral-covered canyons
- Steep terrain
- Hot/dry weather and Santa
 Ana winds
- Very-High and High Fire Hazard Severity Zones
- 89% of building stock pre-2009 (pre-WUI standards)
- Limited evacuation routes
- Communication "deadzones"
- Vulnerable grid dependency


HOLISTIC VISION OF THE OJAI VALLEY FIRE SAFE COUNCIL





- Windshield Survey
 - 2 components:
 - Persimmon Hill Subdivision
 - general risk assessment
 - Individual Homes Zone 0, fuel pathways to home
- Sharing information
 - Persimmon Hill Subdivision
 Assessment: to you
 - Individual Home Assessments:
 between landowner and us

Persimmon Hill: Becoming a Firewise Community

- Insurance
 - new regulation requires insurers to take into account risk mitigation taken at the parcel level

 - Street signs, potential insurance discounts
- Application Steps
 - Organize committee, boundary
 - Plan action plan, risk assessment
